During term four the teachers and students at Glenroy Public School will be embarking on a learning journey of discovery with our local community and Jenn Reed (Educational Landscaper) to understand the stories of the land, the plants, animals and people that have created the history and culture of our school.

We will come together to share and hear the stories and use this knowledge to influence our decisions to restore our schools ecosystem and create an immersive, innovative, outdoor learning environment.

How can I be involved? There are lots of ways we would like you to join us. Initially we would like to invite the community to join a story telling time with students. Please let the school know if you would like to join our sessions.

Wish list for the outdoor spaces - We are gathering ideas from the community to better understand what you would like to see in the outdoor space at the school. Please let us know your thoughts via Seesaw with the class teacher or a note sent in.

Working Bee - Once the design decisions with the students and the community have been made, we hope to build the project together. A working bee will be planned for Stage 1 in the middle of term 4, the date is to be confirmed. The project is for the entire school, focusing on the Prep Area for Stage 1.

A newsletter will be coming out regularly to let you know what's happening with the Outdoor Design Project.

Story telling under the trees

In creating the outdoor learning project, teachers and School Learning Support Officers will tell stories to the children outdoors or find a tree to sit under a tree to assist with the design process.

 - Species identification
 - Data Collection
 - Storm water catchment
 - Measuring
 - Photography
 - Design drafting/drawing
 - Carpentry/construction
 - Planting and propagating
- Other focus will be
- Craftsmanship techniques
 - Agriculture
 - Sustainability
 - Land custodianship
